# WORDS FROM EMMA HOGG, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Wildworks was founded by Bill Mitchell in 2005. Devastatingly we lost Bill in April 2017, but we continued creating two more shows that we started with him and that kept us busy until 2018. 2019 was a tough year as we faced the reality of a world without Bill but knowing he wanted us to continue we carried on seeking out a future. We took some time to evaluate the future and we were just getting ourselves together when the pandemic hit, and we all know what happened to live theatre at that point. All in all it's been a pretty tough 5 years; a rollercoaster of emotions, planning, postponing, re-planning...BUT we are here, we survived and we are loving making and sharing a show with you all.

The appointment of Mydd Pharo as Artistic Director cemented an evolution of Wildworks ready for the future whatever it might bring. Mydd and I both volunteered on A Very Old Man with Enormous Wings in 2005 so there is a level of serendipity that we find ourselves in partnership 17 years later with a joint commitment to supporting and creating opportunities for others to find their way to us and into the arts.

We originally conceived (quite a different version) of I Am Kevin for Truro in summer 2021 but again, the universe was against us and that wasn't to be. However, without the support we received from Truro, in particular Glenn Caplin-Gray at the CloS LEP, Rob Orchard at Cornwall Council, Truro City Council and Charlotte at Salt Projects, this project wouldn't be happening today, and my heartfelt thanks goes to them and their teams.

Every show is bigger than just us. We delight in working in collaboration. As you read on you will get a sense of the number of people that have been involved in the creation of I Am Kevin and we are grateful to every single person and organisation who has given their time, their money, their support, their stories, their trust. At the top of my list I would like to thank the Wildworks team, from the brilliant gang in the office staring at a spreadsheet or cursing the printer to the superb company you see before you this evening and those just out of sight, not on the stage taking the curtain call- every role is critical and you are all amazing. I would also like to thank the Wildworks' Board of Trustees whose unending support, advice and expertise has helped steer this ship through some pretty stormy waters.

# WORDS FROM MYDD PHARO, DIRECTOR, ARTISTIC DIRECTOR

#### WILDWORKS - 'We create stories to try and explain the chaos'

Our shows are always wild and elemental like the Carlyon Bay beaches, the site is steeped in stories- a vast history, ghosts of the great singing out to be released from its sandy labyrinth and joined by new narratives.

This way of working can be tough, a real workout for the body, head and heart. We accept the gifts when they are given. It's elemental and you would be foolish to expect the weather, the sea, the winds, the rain and the seagulls to behave. We are brave and we hold our nerve.

It's essential to embrace the crashing waves, celebrate the driving rain, sing hard into the wind and thrive in the scorching sun. It's a wild love affair with the landscape, that longs for moments of tenderness, stillness, balmy evenings and intimacy. Stolen moments together when the clouds part and you can lay in the stars together.

#### 'Not like the tales we were told when we were young'

We have always delved deep into mythology and fairy-tale. Overflowing with both darkness and light, our shows, at their best are an emotional feast that resonate throughout generations.

Our work has always been, bold, poetic, loud, rude, surprising, visual, fiery and honest. And 'I am Kevin' doesn't stray from that path at all. This is a fairy-tale but not like the ones that we were told when we were young. It's a bedtime story to set the world on fire It's a fever dream of hope.

# 'In the beginning there was darkness and light. We are all born from it, made of it'

In these times, all of us, collectively and individually are having to question how we see ourselves and the world. Revisiting old narratives and rewriting them for the future.

At times travelling into our darkness, breaching our own personal boundaries and facing the 'monsters' we shut out long ago. Searching out those moments of absurdity, joy and beautiful surrender. Remembering and honouring those memories but reinventing ourselves and moving forward.

This story is a provocation to search out the 'monsters', walk with them and redefine those stories that try to define us.


'Your story runs through you like the rings of a tree Like the names carved in its bark Like Blackpool rock'

# WORDS FROM HANNAH MCPAKE, WRITER

Mydd and I first began talking about I am Kevin two years ago, back then we were planning a very different show for a different location and a slightly different world. We were still in lockdown and we spoke a lot, on Zoom; about ideas for the show, about the things that were in our head, about how our relationship with the outside world had shifted, about feeling on the edge, and, at times, that the world was impossibly dark.


We spoke about the power of stories and imagination to shape the world around us. The stories we all carry within us - some we might wish to leave behind others that we are still to find.

The show continued to adapt and change as the world continued to shift. We had to postpone for a year, we lost locations. When Wildworks found Carlyon Bay, we reimagined the story again - to match the scale of the environment, something more elemental, mythic. But at its heart I am Kevin has always been the story of a boy struggling to find his place in the world, who has lost control of his narrative and must journey through the darkness to find it again.

During rehearsals the actors, creative team and community performers have continued to shape the story and the world, making it richer, fuller, to find the light in the darkness with moments of real joy and playful humor. This is my first show with Wildworks and it's a real privilege to be working with the company in such a special location.











# WORDS FROM BENJI BOWER, COMPOSER

Over the last 18 months I have worked very closely with Mydd to realise his musical vision for I AM KEVIN.

Very early on we decided that it would be a recorded soundtrack, partly due to wanting to create a cinematic underscore, and to give us more scope musically than a roaming band of acoustic instruments. Also the nature of the show, having multiple stages, we wanted to have the opportunity to make different soundscapes for each, and we felt that a live set up would limit us in achieving this. Mydd was very clear in his musical choices, the process for me normally begins with conversations with the director and seeing where the sound world is, creating a pallet of instruments to play with. Because of the mythical nature of the show we wanted to create a theme that was steeped in folk music, a timeless song passed down through generations. This was the base to start creating the other musical themes and motifs that would weave through the show.

For some of the bigger cast tunes like the song for Scylla, Mydd was very keen to get a very retro vintage diva ballad for Aminita to sing; taking inspiration from old 60s records and artists. Also the influence of eastern European/Baltic States music was a driving force for the song 'Out There' which underscores the section where the child grows up.

The use of orchestral strings runs heavily through the score and I wanted to compose an epic and emotive bed for the cast to lie on. I am always trying to get to the heart of the story through the music being brave and not shying away from the darkness. In this process I am a slave to the story, and my job as composer is to hopefully help tell the tale through the music.


