Story Shelter

You are invited to contribute a fabric patch or panel to be a part of a large collective shelter as part of Wildworks' Hello Stranger project.

Aim - To create a Safe Haven, a Story Shelter to welcome a stranger to Cornwall.

What is it? – The Shelter will be composed of a series of fabric panels made by individuals or groups using recycled fabrics. The completed panels will be gathered and transformed into a tent.



How will you make it? – The panels will be created in various ways; you don't need to be an expert at sewing. Be bold and be brave!

Who is it for? Everyone! The tent will be on public display in October 2024.

Story Shelter is part of the Hello Stranger program created by Wildworks – the leading landscape theatre company in the UK. This ambitious project is supported by the Good Growth Fund and involves over 60 artists actively engaging with diverse individuals and communities. The outreach is extensive, from collaborating with St Petrocs and those experiencing homelessness, working with disadvantaged and marginalised young people in Cornwall, involving Death Cafés and people experiencing loss, engaging with refugees, connecting with people living with disabilities, building relationships with the WI, and reaching out to individuals in the hospitality and farming sectors. As part of this comprehensive project, Wildworks have fostered partnerships with Cornwall schools. This includes conducting workshops in ten secondary schools and creating work with five schools and their communities, where they introduce their innovative approaches to theatre in the landscape.

These diagrams are not to scale.

The Panels are designed to be in 'Portrait" mode (tall and thin), but you can make it Landscape if you want.

Please use as much recycled textiles and natural fabrics as possible.

Your contribution can be made as a group or by dedicated individuals.

Please leave a 2 cm seam allowance around the panels and patches so that they can be edged and finished, with fixing tapes added at a later date.
